"The testing data showed that the overall best helmet currently available to the public is the Riddell Revolution Speed, which earned the only "5-star" rating.

The next category includes five very good performing helmets that were all given a "4-star" rating: Schutt ION 4D, Schutt DNA Pro+, Xenith X1, Riddell Revolution, and Riddell Revolution IO."

The results clearly show that the newer technologies across all manufacturers are significantly better at reducing the risk of concussions compared to the older models,"

Worrying Increase in Youth Football Injuries

As an appropriate follow-up, the helmet safety rating system seems to be in need as youth football injuries continue to increase:

"...an estimated **5.25 million football-related injuries** among children and adolescents between 6 and 17 years of age were treated in U.S. emergency departments between 1990 and 2007.

The annual number of football-related injuries increased 27 percent during the 18-year study period, jumping from 274,094 in 1990 to 346,772 in 2007."

The study, <u>published in the journal *Clinical Pediatrics*</u>, found the following breakdown of specific injuries:

- Sprains and strains (31%)
- Fracture/dislocations (28%)
- Soft tissue injuries (24%)

Perhaps even more alarming were that **concussions accounted for 8,631 injuries each year**.
